INTRODUCTION

Welcome to Wash Week 2010. This year the Wash Estuary Project has been working with The Wash and North Norfolk Coast European Marine Site Management Scheme to produce a week long programme of events from around The Wash and the North Norfolk Coast.

The events have been prepared by many organisations and volunteers who have designed them to show the natural, cultural, historic heritage and conservation value of the area. We hope you enjoy the wide choice of events that the two projects have brought together.

GENERAL TIPS AND GUIDELINES

Booking and costs - it is best to call individual event organisers in advance to book places and to find out about any costs. Some events are FREE.

Food and drink - unless stated, presume they are not available or ask the organiser.

Transport and parking - if you are unfamiliar with the area we have provided a rough guide to indicate the location of the events. More specific information can be gathered at the local Tourist Information Centres or contact the event organisers themselves. Parking is available at some sites but a charge may be incurred. It is best to check beforehand with the organiser.

Weather - the weather around The Wash and North Norfolk Coast can change quickly. Please check the weather forecast before setting out and bring appropriate clothing for warm or wet conditions. Stout footwear is recommended for guided walks or visiting a nature reserve.

Children - children are welcome to nearly all of the events (except where stated) but they must always be accompanied by a responsible adult.

Dogs - dogs with a responsible owner may be welcome at some events. Please check with individual event organisers first. In all cases dogs MUST be kept on a lead and you MUST clean up after them.

Accessibility - please call the event organiser to check details and discuss arrangements where appropriate.

As much as we want you to enjoy the area please try not to disturb the wildlife and remember to take all rubbish home with you.
